## **INFORMATION NOTE**

**<u>RE</u>** : Evolution of the measures taken by the government to avoid the introduction of Covid 19 (Coronavirus) in French Polynesia.

Given the global epidemiological evolution Covid 19 (coronavirus), and in the continuation of measures put in place on 28 January and 7, 19 and 20 February in order to avoid the introduction of the coronavirus in French Polynesia, the French Polynesian government has decided to adapt the measures relating to the medical certificate.

Following the information note of 7 February 2020, travellers of any nationality, who have stayed since 1 January 2020 in one of the fifteen Asian countries with cases of Covid 19 were required to present a medical certificate not older than 5 days certifying the traveller's health status before boarding flights bound for French Polynesia, whatever their port of embarkation.

As of date, a medical certificate stating the traveller's health status is free of any signs of coronavirus infection, not older than 5 days, must be presented when boarding flights bound for French Polynesia by any traveller who stayed in any <u>risk area</u> in the 30 days before the trip.

The list of areas at risk, extended to regions other than Asia, including Europe, is available on the website of the Health Directorate of and is updated based on the epidemiological evolution of the virus.
